What to Bring:

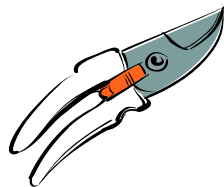
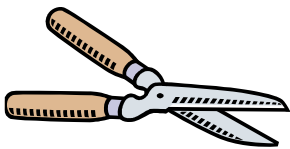
- Appropriate safety equipment (work gloves, work boots, etc.)
